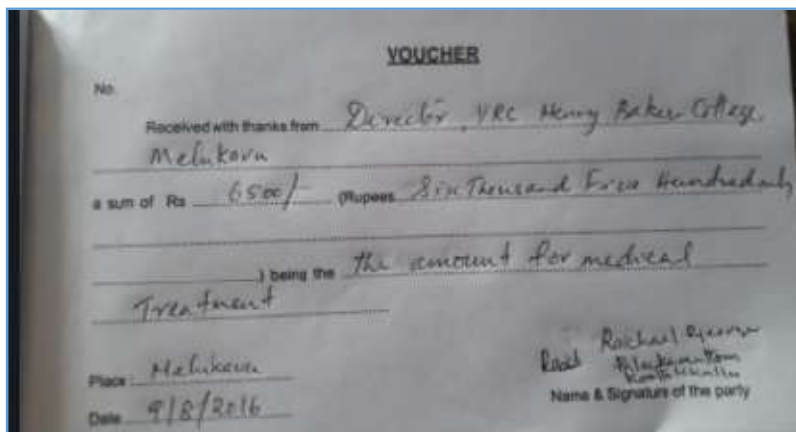
INTER-SCHOOL QUIZ COMPETITION ON <i>WORLD POPULATION DAY</i>

ORGAN DONATION AWARENESS PUBLIC CAMPAIGN

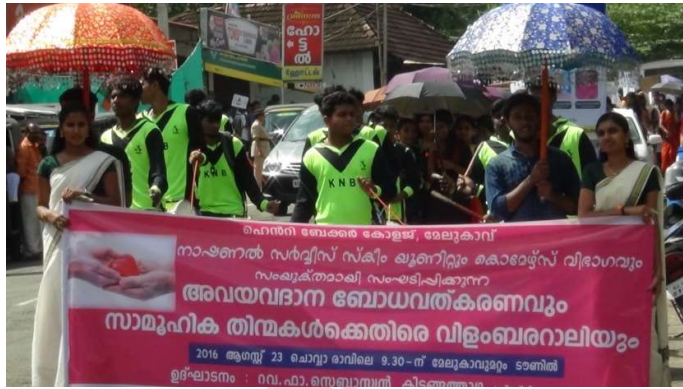




TALK ON WOMEN IN INDIA BY DAYABHAI

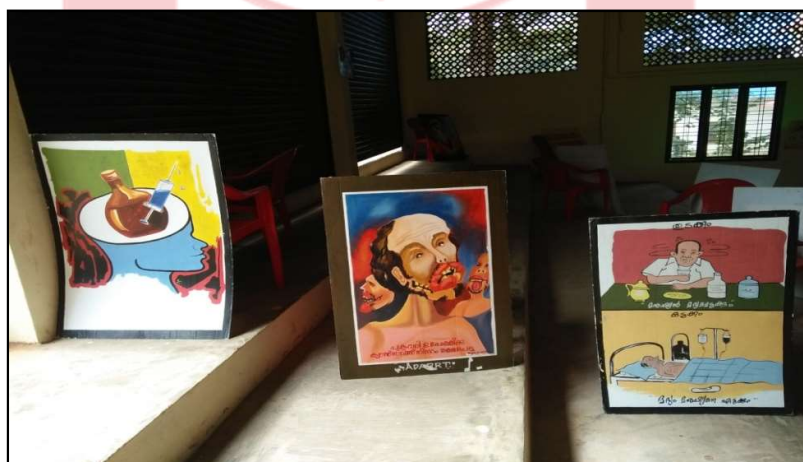
