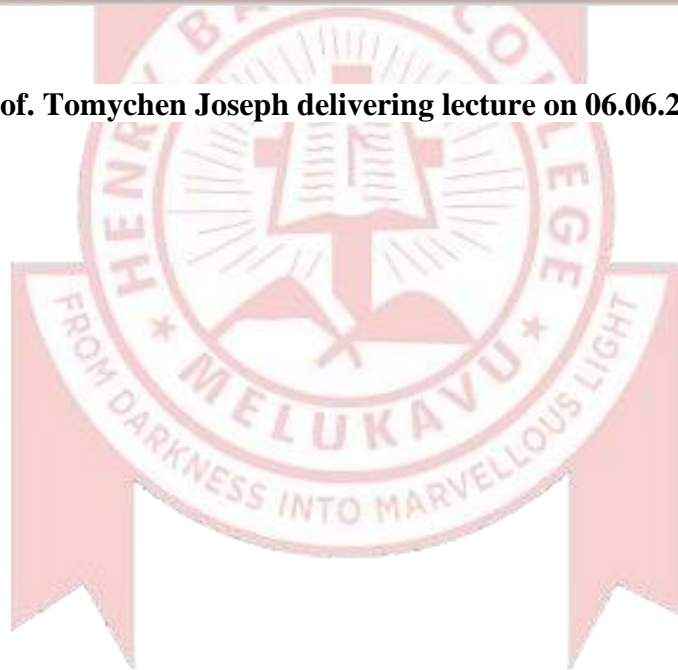

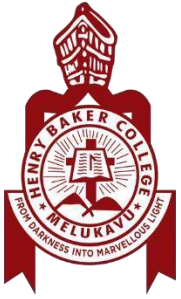

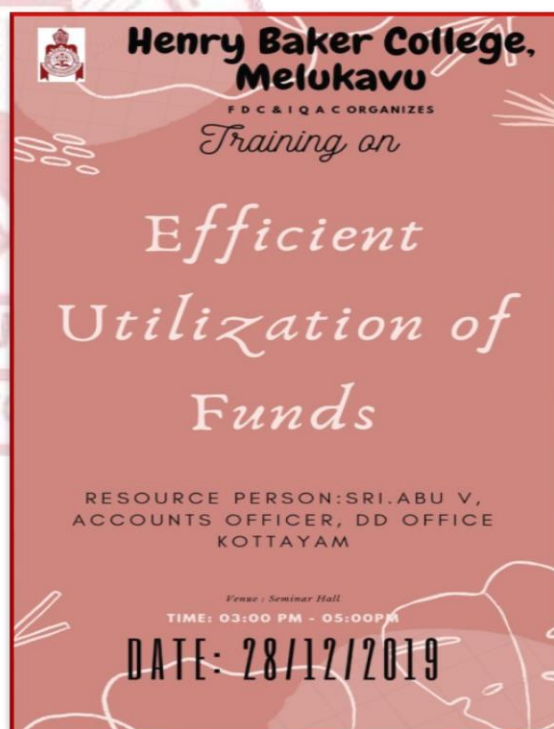
# Report of the Administrative Training Programme

# Report of the Administrative Training Programme

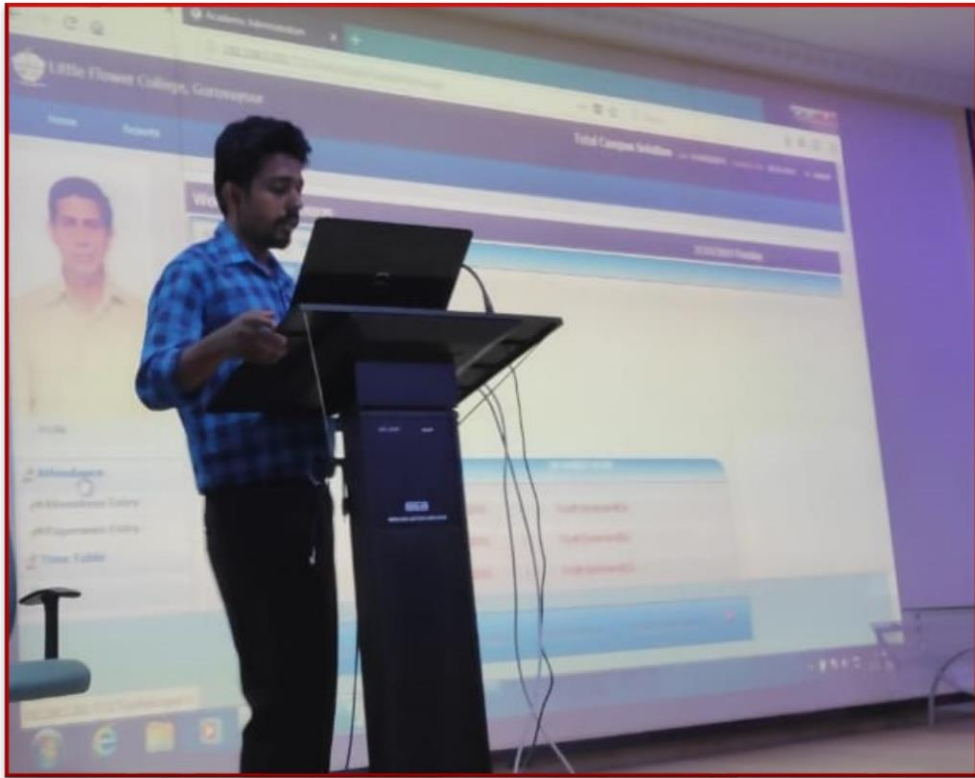
## Efficient Use of Technology in Administration

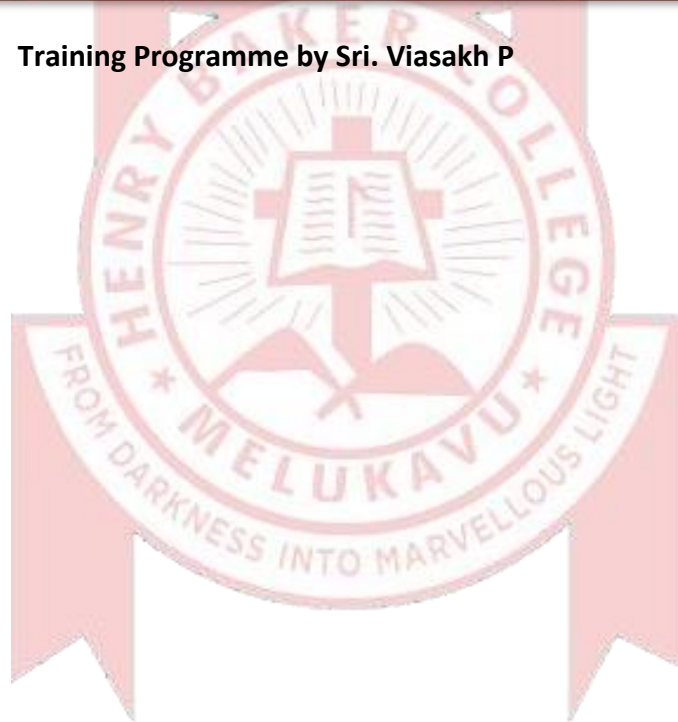

**Training Programme by Sri. Viasakh P**

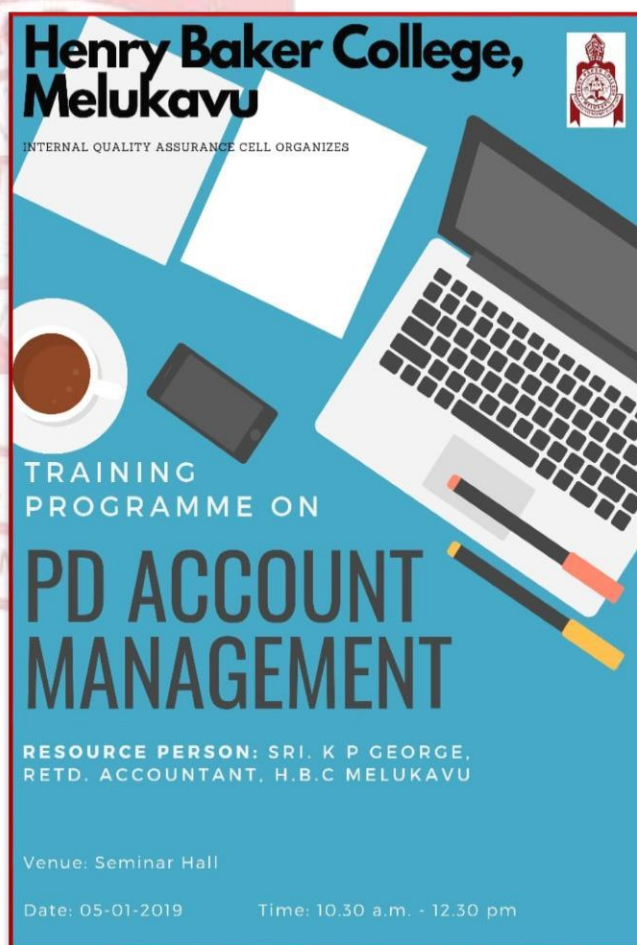


# Report of the Administrative Training Programme

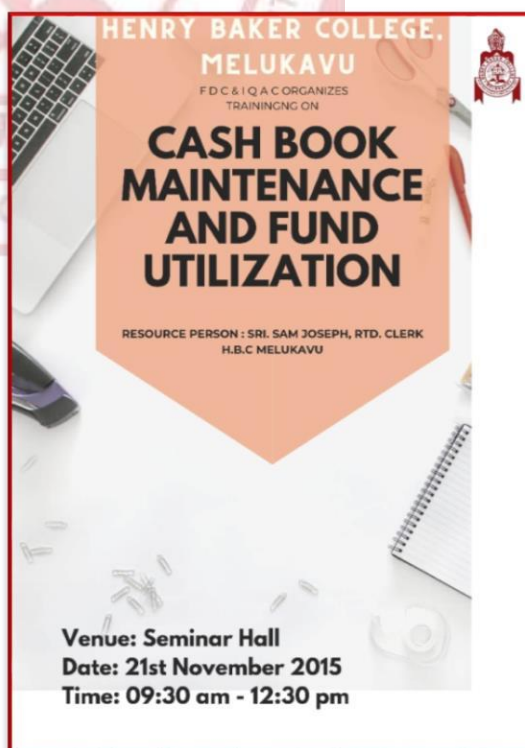

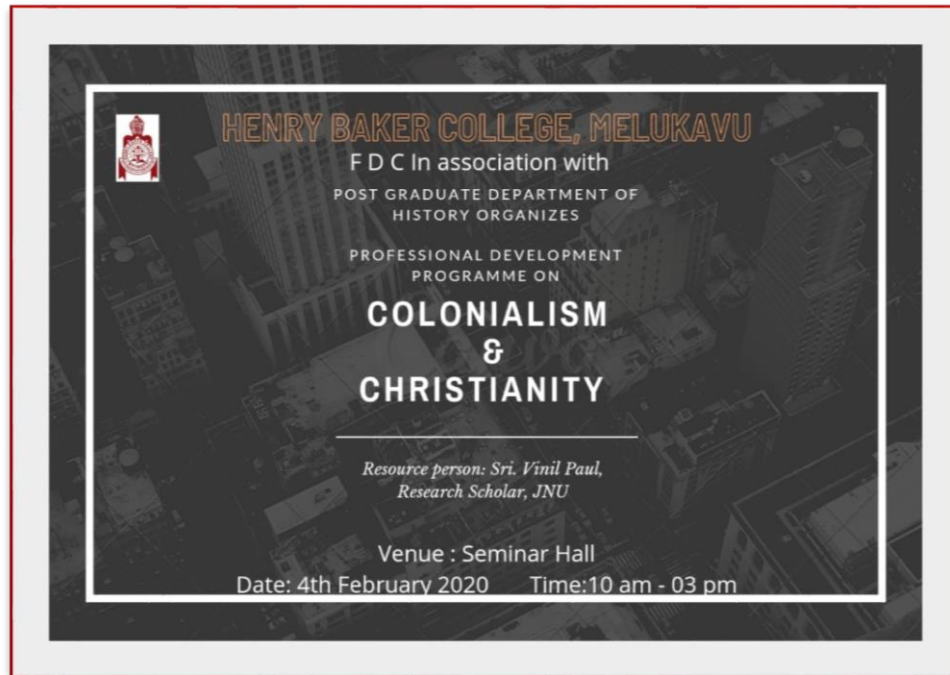
## Colonialism and Christianity: A History of Evangelical Mission Work among the Travancore Hill Tribes

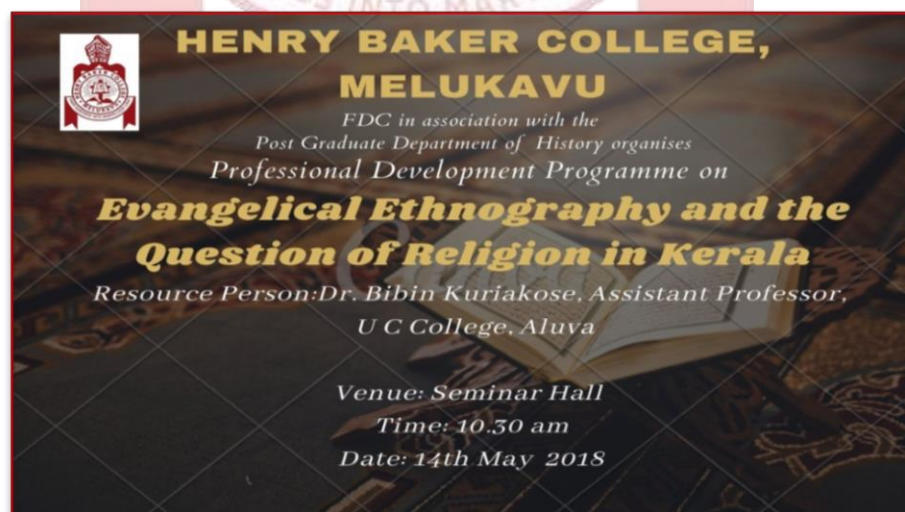

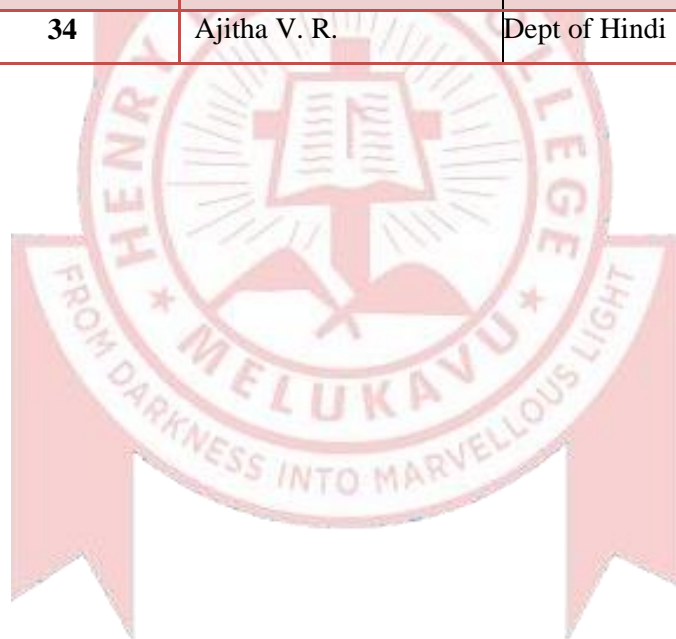
