



Iron Age: Burial Monument and Time Frame

Dr Jenne Peter, Assistant Professor, U C College, Aluva talked on "Iron Age: Burial Monument and Time Frame". Dr Jenne Peter, in her power point presentation, exhibited the photographs of various types of megaliths and explained its specialties to the participants. According to Dr. Jenne Peter, the presence of megaliths in cultural heritage is of great importance for most countries throughout the world. These objects exist in all continents, creating a unique network of priceless cultural geosites. Areas on which megalithic buildings are located create a uniquely mysterious aura; they intrigue, stimulate the imagination, and often evoke the feeling of communing with something supernatural. Since the dawn of time, these places have been surrounded by a specific cult, playing an important role in the development of civilization. Kerala is abundant with megalithic monuments. During her discussion she emphasized the need of preserving such monuments for conserving our past and, in many places, local people sometimes damaged such stones. So, it is our responsibility to preserve our past. Several students asked questions and had a live discussion on the topic. Nineteen students and eighteen teachers INTO MAY attended the programme.





- Seminar: The Question of Adivasi Land in Kerala: Tracing Roots from History

During the academic year 2015-16, a Professional Development Programme on "The Question of Adivasi Land in Kerala" conducted on 19th March 2016. The Meeting was presided over by Dr. Abraham Daniel, former principal and HOD of the Department of History. Dr. Ani Teresa Ephraim, Associate Professor, SreeSankaracharya University of Sanskrit, Kalady delivered the lecture on the topic, The Question of Adivasi Land in Kerala: Tracing Roots from History. She illustrates that the question of Adivasi land was always a contesting subject. From the British period onwards Adivasis started their struggle. Even after the independence this struggle is continuing. The struggles like Vellarada Land Struggle, Muthanga Land struggle; Arippa Land Struggles and Thovarimala Land Struggles are a few instances of their struggle. These are some popular movements, whereas for Adivasis' every day in their life is a struggle -struggle with non-tribes, struggle with wild animals, struggle for their rights etc. She reiterated the concern for this voiceless marginal and entrusted each of us to stand for their cause. Faculties and PG students has been benefitted from the programme.
