

3. International Yoga Day- Poster Circulation- 21.06. 2022








5. World Population Day- Poster Designing Competition 11/07/2022


7. Orientation Programme for NSS Programme Officers- 22.07.2022 to 23.07.2022.

10. Flood Relief Activities: Cleaning of Government Ayurveda Dispensary, Moonilavu Gram Panchayat- 08.08.2022

Cleaning and disinfecting after the flood is a major undertaking. The NSS Unit of Henry Baker College, cleaned Government Ayurveda Dispensary, Moonilavu Gramapanchayat on 08.08.2022. Out volunteers removed the flood waters inside the hospital and washed the floor thoroughly. Floors, toilets, walls, tables, chairs and benches were thoroughly cleaned with hot soapy water and disinfected the surfaces with chlorine bleach solution. It was an arduous task as the floodwater carried silt, sewage and other wastes that can cause bacterial, viral or parasitic diseases. They sanitized and disinfected the vials. They discarded the items that absorbed the flood water and cannot be cleaned or disinfected. The volunteers' efforts to re-arrange the medicines and other articles in the hospital were commendable. 18 students participated in the programme.


Different Phases of Freedom Wall




14. Orientation Programme for NSS Programme Officers- 19.08.2022 & 20.08.2022






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21. Swatch Bharath Mission- Cleaning Drive: Gandhi Jayanti Day- 02.10.2022-



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
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



27. Intensive Volunteers Enrolment Programme organised by Nehru Yuva Kendra, Kottayam – 19/10/2022








28. Best NSS Volunteer Award 2021-22-20.10.2022



29. Awareness Class on Rabies and Contagious Diseases-26.10.2022

The NSS unit of Henry Baker College, in association with Community health Centre, Edamaruku organised an awareness class on "Rabies and Contagious Diseases" on 26.10.2022. The first dose of the four-dose course should be administered as soon as possible after exposure. Additional doses should be administered on days 3, 7, and 14 after the first vaccination. He elaborated on the impact of rabies and other contagious diseases on humans and animals. 


30. Anti- Drug Awareness Programme-28.10.2022




33. Pre RD Camp Selection

39. Blood Donation Camp and Eye Test Camp-11.01.2023







40. Global Academic Carnival, Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam-16.01.2023




On 26th January 2023, Dr. G S Gireesh Kumar, Principal of our college hoisted the National Flag and delivered Republic Day message.








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







46. Old Age Home visit and Wheelchair Donation-24.03.2023




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


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
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47. Cleaning Drive- Puzhanadatham- River Clean- up Programme-29.04.2023




