


### Annual Report 2023-24

The Department of English, conducts a plethora of programmes every year. These programmes are for the students of the English department and for those of other departments. These programmes act as a whetting stone for sharpening the various skills of the students. Their creativity and skills are enhanced through these programmes. The following is the annual report of the activities of English Department during the year 2023 -2024.

#### 1. National Reading Day Celebration: “Biblio”

The Department of English organised a program called "Biblio" as part of National Reading Day and Month celebrations. The primary objective of the program was to promote a love for reading among students and emphasize the importance of libraries as valuable resources for knowledge and personal growth. As part of the programme, the students of the Department of English visited the college library on June 30, 2023 at 3.00 p.m. Each student selected a book that appealed to them, ranging from classic literature to modern fiction, non-fiction, and poetry. After selecting a book, the students were requested to spend time reading it and then write a review of their chosen book. 
### 3. Excursion

The sessions also included discussions on effective literature review strategies, data collection methodologies, and research ethics to further enhance the students' understanding of research methodology. A total of twenty-one students attended the workshop.



## 5. Mastering Microsoft Office for Academic Purposes

The Department of English, Henry Baker College, Melukavu in association with Institution's Innovation Council organized a workshop on "Mastering Microsoft Office for Academic Purposes" for the III Year B. A English students on 07.02.2024 in the Computer Lab from 10.00 am. to 1.00 pm. The students were guided on formatting guidelines, structuring their reports, using referencing tools, and creating professional-looking documents for academic submissions.

The program not only enhanced the students' technical skills but also improved their confidence in presenting and communicating their ideas effectively. The program served as a platform for students to develop practical skills and enhance their overall learning experience.

## 12. A Word A Day


Objective: To enhance the vocabulary and phonetic skills of B.A.English students







#### 14. Poster Designing




**Outcome-** This activity triggered the literary consciousness of the students. It developed the observational skills of the students and created an awareness of the major luminaries in literature.



## Summary Report

### An Introduction to Shakespeare

A certificate programme on Shakespeare was conducted by the department of English. It was a 30 hour duration programme. The department started the programme on 16/01/2024. It was offered to the first and second year B.A.English students. A written examination was conducted at the end of the programme. The examination was one of multiple choice type. Of the 16 participants, one student secured A grade, seven got B grade, five got C grade and three got D grade.

Outcome: The participants acquired an awareness of the vastness of the literature of Shakespeare. All his works were introduced to them and they could also understand Shakespearean English and how it is different from modern English.
