February at College Seminar Hall. Dr. Nisha Joseph, Principal-in-charge, inaugurated the

exhibition. The exhibited photographs were mostly varities of Butterflies that flies around

in our college campus. It took months of patience and dedication for the members to

capture the photographs of college eco system. Lantana Camara (Lanthana Camara), a

species of flowering plant is centre of attractionfor Butterflies that lives inside the campus premises. Photographs of Dragonflies, reptiles like Chameleon, Bee hives, Frogs also became part of the exhibition. Albin C. J. of II B A English took three months of dedication and effort to capture photographs of different species of butterflies and six of dragonflies. Prof. Mathew Thomas, Assistant Professor of Zoology, St. Thomas College, Pala, guided students to find out the names of Butterflies and Dragonflies. Almost all students, teachers, non-teaching staff, and presbyters of the East Kerala Diocese visited the exhibition and appreciated Albin C. J's work. A collection of 43 photos were exhibited in exhibition and later made an album out of it.
