


1. Association inauguration and commemoration of Hiroshima Day

Dr. Disha V. J welcomed the gathering which was followed by the presidential address by our Principal, Dr. G. S Gireesh Kumar. Sri. Ajith Thomas delivered an invited lecture on the topic 'Physics around Us'. The lecture mainly focussed on the applications of physics in our daily life through experimental demonstrations. 40 students participated in the meeting.

2. Ozone day celebration 2019

One day seminar on World Ozone day 2019

To create awareness about the preservation of ozone layer and the need for adopting an eco-friendly lifestyle among students and teachers, the Department of Physics, Henry Baker College organized a one day programme on 25th September 2019 with the financial support from Kerala State Council for Science, Technology and Environment (KSCSTE) based on this year's focal theme "32 Years and Healing".

The programme was organized in three sessions. The meeting was commenced with the inaugural session, followed by an invited lecture and an intercollegiate science quiz competition. More than 90 UG students and faculties were participated in the event.

In the inaugural session, Dr. Disha V. J., coordinator of the programme welcomed the gathering. Dr. G. S. Gireesh Kumar, Principal, Henry Baker College, presided over the function wherein he highlighted the main objectives of the programme. The function was inaugurated by lighting the lamp by chief guest, Dr. Ajith James Jose, Assistant Prof. in Chemistry, St. Berchmans College, Changanacherry. Dr. Prince Thomas proposed the vote of thanks.

In session II, Dr. Ajith James Jose delivered a lecture on '32 years and Healing'. In his scientific lecture, various topics related to ozone layer depletion, its causes, impacts and the efforts made by international community for the preservation of ozone layer were highlighted. He also pointed out various ways for keeping our environment and atmosphere clean so that not only humans, but also the plants and animals can live a healthy life in future.

Session-III started at 12 pm with the preliminary round of Intercollegiate Science Quiz Competition. The preliminary round was a written test comprising of 30 questions based on Environmental Science and Basic Science. Twenty-one teams from nearby colleges participated in the event. After the preliminary round five teams were selected for the final round. Dr. Jobin Job Mathen, Department of Physics, St. Thomas College, Pala presided as the Quiz master. Final round started at 1.30 pm. The winners were:
