#### Report 2023-2024

#### 1. Reading Competition






#### 3. Malayala Samajam Inauguration and Kaviarangu

#### 5. Keralappiravi dinakhosham

The Malayala samajam, Women's Cell and Cultural Club organised the following programmes as part of the 67 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of Keralappiravi. On November 1, 2023 we conducted three events -ie, Kerala Sreeman, Malayali Manga and Uthama Malayalee.

- **1. Kerala Sreeman:** In the competition held in four rounds -namely Kerala culture, art, general knowledge, Malayalam alphabet knowledge, Gopikrishnan B, third year B.A. History student, was selected as the Kerala Shriman. Naseem Muhammad, III B.Com was selected as the runner-up.
- **2. Malayali Manga:** Culture of Kerala, Art, General Knowledge, Malayalam Alphabet Knowledge etc. were the four rounds for the competition. Kumari Hiba Fatima, II B.A English, was selected as the Malayalee Manga. Kumari Atmaja, I B.Com was selected as first runner up of Malayali manga.
- **3.** Uttama Malayalee- Various questions were asked to the 9 participants regarding the importance of Malayalam language and marks were given based on the language skills and general knowledge about Kerala. Kumari Hiba Fathima, II B.A English, was selected as the Uthama Malayalee. Gouri Nandakumar, I B.A English was the first runner up.

After these programmes we organised a public program in the college campus at 1.15 pm in view of the importance of Malayalam language. Principal. Dr. Girish Kumar G. S. presided over the meeting. Dr. Soumya Paul spoke about the importance of the Malayalam language and Kerala culture. In the meeting, the principal recited the Malayalam language pledge. 




#### 7. Book Review






#### 8. Ezhuthola Release
