The Self Study Report (SSR) submission and Data Validation and Verification process had been completed during the academic year 2020-2021. After a few months awaiting, a three member team consisting of **Dr. Gangadhar Panda, Chairperson of the NAAC Peer Team Visit, Dr. Aftab Alam, Member Co-coordinator of the NAAC Peer Team Visit and Dr. Rajinder Singh, Member, NAAC Peer Team** visited and evaluated qualitative processes in the college on 20th – 21st September 2021, and expressed great agreement over it. The College Governing Body, Staff Council and IQAC wholeheartedly welcome the NAAC Peer Team members. They made a strategic evaluation of the curricular and other associated activities of the college. **On 6th October, NAAC announced the result and the college got accredited for the first time with “A” grade with CGPA of 3.06.**

4. Erudite Lecture on National Education Policy

The IQAC of the college organized a lecture on the topic 'Redesigning Higher Education in India: Embracing a New Paradigm' on 28.04.2022, 2 pm at HBC Conference Hall. . The resource person was Prof. Dr. R K Chauhan, Former Secretary, UGC, New Delhi, Pro-Chancellor, Lingayas Vidyapeeth, Faridabad, Former Vice Chancellor, (Guru Jambhashwar University, Haryana, Siksha O Anusandhan University, Bhubaneswar, Lingayas University, Faridabad, The Global Open University, Nagaland). Dr. Nisha Joseph, IQAC Co-ordinator welcomed the gathering. Dr. Gireesh Kumar G S, Principal presided over the function. During the presidential address, he briefly explained the historical advances of the country's education policies after its independence. Prof. Dr. R K Chauhan, started his speech with the ancient university of Bologna and its education policy. He also explained the different aspects of policy making and the evolution of National Education Policy 2020. Mr. Chauhan reiterated that quality in education is a significant challenge for higher education. To improve education quality, UGC is trying to instill New Education Policy in higher education. The present perspectives on the new education system and the need for change required for the development of the nation through education were analyzed in the second session.

A fruitful discussion on the queries from the audience was done at the end of the talk. With this session, it was made clear that the fundamental objective behind NEP is to bring education out of the limits of narrow thought-process and to integrate it with the thoughts and ideas of the 21st century. It was followed by felicitation speech of Rev. Biju Joseph, College Bursar.

The external Annual Academic Audit for the academic year was carried out by Dr. Roy Scaria Associate Professor in charge of Principal, TM Jacob Memorial Government College, Manimalakunnu.

III. PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT/ ADMINISTRATIVE TRAINING PROGRAMMES

1. 'Digital Libraries and Online Facilities in Education'

The programmes of Faculty Development Centre of the college for the academic year 2020-21 were inaugurated by the principal, Dr. Gireeshkumar G.S. on 18/11/2021. Objective of the program was to get familiarized with Digital Libraries and other online facilities for education and know all about Google Add-ons and their applications. The program was held in two sessions, and the first session was taken by Mr. Isson George, College Librarian. The first half of the session was solely on the digital library source of the college and how teachers and students can access it. It was effective and informative for each one of us.

2. Google Add-ons and App

The second session was taken by Mr. Sudhish S. Nair, Assistant Professor in Computer Application, Henry Baker College, Melukavu on *Google Add-ons* and *App*. The objective was to familiarise various customized applications that integrate with Google Workspace applications. Hands on training on various applications like Form Presenter, Certify'em, Google Lens and Google Art and Culture was an eye-opener for us. Form presenter is an add-on application for Google G-suite that present a Google Form with various configurations for conducting on line assessments and exams with time. Certify'em enables to generate and issue certificates online. Google Lens is an image recognition technology designed to bring up relevant information related to objects it identifies using visual analysis based on a neural network. Google Arts & Culture is an online platform of high-resolution images and videos of artworks and cultural artifacts from partner cultural organizations throughout the world.

The session was very informative and gave an idea regarding how we can integrate these *Google Add-ons* in teaching and learning. The program was attended by twenty-eight teachers.

3. Tools for Effective Online Teaching

Faculty Development Centre in association with the Internal Quality Assurance cell organized a faculty training programme on various ICT tools for online teaching. The resource person was Dr Prince Thomas, Assistant Professor, Department of Physics. The training held on 22nd November 2021, at the college computer lab was aimed to introduce various ICT tools which are very useful for online teaching. He introduced the applications of OpenBoard, Xournal, Edpuzzle and some useful Chrome Extensions- Wikiwand and Mercury Reader. OpenBoard is free and open-source interactive whiteboard software compatible with any projector and pointing device. It is almost like a board that can be used for writing in real-time teaching. Xournal is an application for note taking, sketching with PDF annotation support. The programme was attended by twenty-eight participants.

4. Orientation for Administrative Staff

Faculty Development Centre in association with the Deputy Directorate of Collegiate Education, Kottayam and IQAC of the college organised an orientation programme for administrative staff. The programme held on 27.11.2021 was aimed at making them aware of various rules and regulations regarding the functioning of the college office. The programme was inaugurated by Dr R. Pragash, Deputy Director, Collegiate Education, Kottayam. Principal Dr Gireesh Kumar GS, presided over the meeting and office superintendent Mr Jomon K. Joseph proposed a vote of thanks. The first session was engaged by Mr. Shine K.S, about PD Rules. The second session was taken by Mr. Babu N P, on the store purchase manual and various registers related to purchasing. Both the sessions were very much informative and useful for the administrative staff. It was attended by 11 participants.

5. Workshop on Outcome Based Education

On 30th April 2022, FDC and Internal Quality Assurance Cell in association with Kerala Higher Education Council organised a workshop on *Outcome Based Education; Measurement of PO, PSO & CO* on Principal, Dr. Gireesh Kumar GS, introduced the resource person, Dr. Manulal P. Ram, Research Officer, Kerala State Higher Education Council. This programme was conducted with a view to make a change in on-going educational practices and upgrades ourselves to Outcome Based Education. Dr. Manulal P. Ram introduced the basic concepts of Programme Outcome (PO), Programme Specific Outcome (PSO) and Course Outcome (CO) and how to formulate these based on Bloom's Revised Taxonomy.

Dr. Shafeeque V, Research Officer, Kerala State Higher Education Council, also handled a session on the need for OBE in the present educational scenario in online mode. The workshop was informative and effective for each one of us. The workshop helped us prepare the Programme Outcome, Programme Specific Outcome and Course Outcome of our programmes. It was attended by 20 teachers.

IV ORIENTATION PROGRAMME FOR STUDENTS

6. Webinar: Learning in Digital Environment

Our world has been witnessing tremendous changes in the teaching-learning scenario since the outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic in 2020. The traditional methods of imparting education failed to meet expectations in the lockdown days. As a result, the digital and virtual methods of learning and teaching substituted the traditional classroom. Though students began to regain the actual classrooms in 2021, the virtual classrooms remained part of the system. So blended learning seems to be the new normalcy of the immediate future at least. Therefore it is the duty of the teachers to empower the students according to the demands of the time.

Objectives of the programme:

1. To let the students know how learning takes place in digital environment.
2. To enlighten them about various e-resources.
3. To familiarize the students with the rapid change that has been taking place in higher education.

Dr. Vimal Kumar shed light on various aspects of teaching-learning like data collection, research, academic writing, publication, using social media websites as a source of knowledge, different knowledge repositories available online and offline etc. in his one hour long presentation. It was indeed a rare display of academic erudition. Students as well as teachers got their doubts clarified in the Q and A at the end of the presentation. 7. Power Stream: An Entertainment Motivation Programme

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell of Henry Baker College, Melukavu conducts a one-day orientation programme for the first-year degree students as part of the Bridge Course every year. Such a programme was organized this year as well. “Power Stream: An Entertainment Motivation Programme” was led by the renowned international trainer and motivational speaker Sri. Jijo Chittady, co-founder of Kenshu Foundation, Kottayam, Kerala. Dr. Nisha Joseph, IQAC Coordinator welcomed the gathering and Principal, Dr. Gireeshkumar G. S. briefed the objectives of the programme in his remarks. Total 120 students attended the programme.

The programme was activity oriented and comprised of five sessions. Each session discussed different topics. In the first session, the speaker exemplified through activities how one can overcome one's limitations. The second session contained motivational stories of people who have achieved things that are considered impossible by many among us. The third session was about finding happiness in life and the worth of happiness over material wealth. In the fourth session, the resource person enlightened the students on leading a life of values. In the final session, all the teachers of the college along with the Principal addressed the students and talked to them about the facilities available in the college, the dream teachers have about the students and the college, how curricular and co-curricular aspects are conveyed to students, the key points each student should keep in mind while pursuing higher education etc. Many of them proclaimed that the training helped them to change their perspective towards

life and education. The coordinator of the programme, Paul Mathews proposed the formal vote of thanks.

8. How to Face an Interview

Henry Baker College in association with G-Tec Computer Education organized an orientation programme for resume writing and interview skill by Anwar Sathic, Marketing Manager, G-Tec Computer Education on 25/10/2021, 11.30 am at College Auditorium. He discussed the tips to find a new opportunity and how to conquer the opportunities before us. The Trainer helped students to get an insight into the career choices and how to cater the needs of industry. More than 120 participants attended.

9. Career Opportunities in Government Sector

The minority cell of Henry Baker College organized an online career orientation programme “*Career Opportunities in Government Sector*” for the final year students on 28th March 2022, at 2 pm, in Google Meet. The IQAC coordinator Dr. Nisha Joseph welcomed the gathering and the Principal Dr. Gireeshkumar G. S. delivered the presidential address. In his speech, the principal emphasized the need of understanding the changing nature of careers in the post-pandemic global scenario. Sri. Krishnakumar S. who is presently the Deputy Chief of the University Employment Information and Guidance Bureau at Cochin University of Science and Technology led the session. He enumerated various career opportunities in the government sector, both state and central. He also explained how and when the major public sector employers conduct recruitment. The session was indeed a beneficial one for many of our students. A total of 73 participants attended the programme. Sri. Justin J. - A Workshop in Research Methodology

2. INSTILLING ENTREPRENEURIAL SKILLS

The Institution Innovation Council of the college has been in the forefront in organizing programmes that instill entrepreneurial attitude among the student community. The in association with Entrepreneur Development Club organized several activities in the last year.

- Industrial Awareness Programme
