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INTRODUCTION

Henry Baker College, Melukavu, is a Christian minority co-educational institution that receives government aid. Established in 1981, the college is named in honor of Rev. Henry Baker Jr., a pioneering CMS missionary often referred to as the "Apostle of the Hills." The college was upgraded in 1991 and achieved first-grade college status in 1999.

The college enjoys the 2(F) and 12(B) status under the UGC Act and offers both Government-aided and self-financing programmes. Special consideration is given to students from Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes to help them become beacons of humanity in this turbulent age. Over the years, the college has shaped the destinies of countless individuals, leading to a brighter future. It has also emerged as a prominent center for teaching, learning and research in higher education. The college is an ISO 9001-2015 certified institution and accredited by NAAC with 'A' Grade in 2021.

Curricular and co-curricular activities of the last academic year went offline as per the directions of the University Grants Commission, Government of Kerala and Mahatma Gandhi University. Anticipating the same, the IQAC of the college organized Faculty Development Programmes and orientation sessions for teachers, and students. 4. WORKSHOP ON OUTCOME BASED EDUCATION

On September 24, 2022, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell, in collaboration with the Kerala Higher Education Council, organized a workshop focused on the Attainment of Outcomes (OBE Scheme), commonly known as Outcome Based Education. Dr. Manulal P. Ram, a Research Officer from the Kerala State Higher Education Council, served as the distinguished resource person for the event. Dr. Nisha Joseph, the IQAC Coordinator, extended a warm welcome to all attendees. In his introductory remarks, Dr. Gireesh Kumar G. S., the Principal, underscored the significance of outcome-based education and its measurement in alignment with the National Education Policy 2020 implementation. Ram elucidated various concepts related to the measurement of Program Outcomes (PO), Program Specific Outcomes (PSO), and Course Outcomes (CO). The technical aspect should encompass problem-solving, critical thinking, and computing skills, while the generic aspect should involve social interaction, group discussions, seminars, and similar elements. He also provided detailed insights into the domains of learning, knowledge categories, and the process of attaining Course Outcomes (CO) and Continuous Internal Evaluation (CIE). In conclusion, he underscored the significance of effective evaluation processes as the primary means of assessing the attainment of course outcomes. He also guided participants in formulating effective methods for evaluating these outcomes. The workshop proved to be highly informative and impactful for all attendees.

Outcome: Participants gained a deeper understanding of Program Outcomes, domains of learning, and evaluation processes, which will enhance their teaching practices and benefit students in the pursuit of quality education





8. Six-Day Employability Skill Training Programme For Girls



10. Research Methodology Workshop

A Cup of Tea, An Image and Memory: On Developing History Dissertations 15/10/2022

Post Graduate Department of History, Henry Baker College, hosted a methodology workshop titled "A Cup of Tea, An Image And Memory: On Developing History Dissertations" on 15th October 2022 at 10.00 a.m. at the college seminar hall. Dr. Jibin Mathew, Assistant Professor of History, gave the welcome speech and introduced Dr. Sebastian Joseph, a noted film and environmental historian. The presidential address was given by Dr. Nisha Joseph, Assistant Professor of History.

Dr. Sebastian Joseph then presented the workshop on how to write history dissertations. The event provided students with new perspectives and suggestions for choosing a research topic for their Postgraduate dissertations. He advised the students to bring in new topics and explore the unattended and unexplored areas. Students also had their questions answered about how to choose a new topic, how to curate research problems, where to find research materials, and so on. The session was on fire, with both the resource person and the students constantly engaging in doubts, questions, and answers.

The session was designed primarily for Postgraduate Students, who must complete their dissertations by the end of their term. The workshop drew 33 students from M A History classes. The meeting came to an end with the vote of thanks by Kannan. M.S, second year M A History student.

11. Seminar on Researching Folklores and Writing History

26/10/2022

Objective

The talk intended to introduce the students to folklore and to understand how folkloric materials are important for the study of the history of a society at present.

Post Graduate Department of History, Henry Baker College, organised the History Association's inaugural ceremony on October 26, 2022, at 10:00 a.m. in the college seminar hall. As part of the ceremony's opening, Dr. Rajesh Komath, an Associate professor in the School of Social Sciences at Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam, gave an invited talk. The event started with a silent prayer. Dr. Beena Paul, Head of the Department gave the welcome address. To provide knowledge about plagiarism and the ways to avoid plagiarism in research was the main objective of the talk.

Post Graduate Department of History, Henry Baker College, conducted a webinar on the topic "Impactful Approach for Plagiarism Free Research" on 27th October 2022 at 2.00 p.m. through Google Meet. Dr. Beena Paul, Head of the Department of History gave the welcome note and introduced the resource person, Dr. Vinod V.M, Research Desk, CHMK University Library,

University of Calicut. Dr. Girish Kumar G.S, Principal, Henry Baker College, delivered the presidential address.

Dr. Vinod V.M. began his presentation by explaining the various types of plagiarism and how, as aspiring researchers, they can do it both consciously and inadvertently. He discussed with them the efficiency of various types of plagiarism-detection software, such as Orkund, Viper, and Plagscan. Additionally, he gave introductions to several websites and magazines for research that the students may use. Overall, it can be said that the workshop was quite educational and interesting. Outcome

The session provided the students with a thorough insight into how to develop plagiarism-free research and complete it successfully without any kinds of errors.

13. Student's Participation in Two day State level Methodology Workshop on

Moreover attending such workshops in other institutions will expose them to yet another educational culture and enhance their potential and capabilities. Accordingly, Seventeen I MA students attended the two day workshop. In the last session, students were given time for the selection of the topic. Our student got the opportunity to present his topic and got suggestions for the same.

14. Workshop on Research Methodology- Department of Commerce
