Henry Baker College Melukavu, is a Christian Minority Educational Institution established, owned and administered by C.S.I East Kerala Diocese, registered as Henry Baker College Educational Society (Reg.No.K. 1056/99 dated. 22-09-1999). The college is named after Rev. Henry Baker Jr., the pioneering CMS missionary popularly known as Apostle of Hills.

Henry Baker College, Melukavu, (Melukavumattom P.O, Kottayam district, Kerala State, India) was founded in 1981 by the C.S.I. Madhya Kerala Diocese providing two year Pre-Degree course of Kerala University; upgraded in1991 and became a first grade college in1999 and later on permanently affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University. The college is now included under 2(F) & 2 (B) of the UGC Act. Henry Baker College, Melukavu, is the only college in Kerala formed for the upliftment of pupils in hilly areas pursuing higher education.






#### **UGC Sponsored Two Day National Workshop (16th and 17th October 2015)**


#### **Study Tours**

The main objective of the session on intellectual property rights was to encourage student innovation and to provide incentives for their innovation by making them aware of the fact that there is legal protection available through legislative enactment to such a student/learner inventor(s) that will allow them to recover research and development investments and reap the benefits of their inventions for a limited period of time. There were 144 participants in the program.



#### STUDENTS' KNOWLEDGE ALBUM




#### **Commerce Folio**


As part of the department level assessment of our students, we conducted systematically



#### II. GANDHIAN THOUGHTS


