Henry Baker College Melukavu, is a Christian Minority Educational Institution established, owned and administered by C.S.I East Kerala Diocese, registered as Henry Baker College Educational Society (Reg.No.K. 1056/99 dated. 22-09-1999). The college is named after Rev. Henry Baker Jr., the pioneering CMS missionary popularly known as Apostle of Hills.

Henry Baker College, Melukavu, (Melukavumattom P.O, Kottayam district, Kerala State, India) was founded in 1981 by the C.S.I. Madhya Kerala Diocese providing two year Pre-Degree course of Kerala University; upgraded in1991 and became a first grade college in1999 and later on permanently affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University. The college is now included under 2(F) & 2 (B) of the UGC Act. Henry Baker College, Melukavu, is the only college in Kerala formed for the upliftment of pupils in hilly areas pursuing higher education.

Postgraduate Department of History

1. Readathon & Reading Club Inauguration

Henry Baker Jr." The principal of the college, Dr. Gireeshkumar G.S, delivered the presidential address. This function was formally inaugurated and made fabulous by the inaugural address of Rt. Rev. Dr. K.G. Daniel, former manager of the college and Bishop of East Kerala Diocese. Dr. P. 6. KCHR Public Interface Programme

The team reached KCHR complex at Vyloppilly Samskriti Bhavan, Thiruvananthapuram at 9.30 am. In the morning itself students got the opportunity to use the KCHR library for anhour and had a glance on new arrivals.



Students also got the chance to visit the Kerala State Archives, which is located nearby. Our team was welcomed to the Archives with a meeting arranged in the Research Hall of State Archives. Shri. J. Rejikumar, Director, Directorate of Archives, addressed the gathering. Sri. Shibu. J. Assistant Conservator, delivered a lecture on the archives department, different types of sources, how to collect sources from archives, the importance of archival sources for the reconstruction of history etc. Archives department also provided a valuable session on conservation and preservation techniques and methods of archival sources. Signature museum was another attraction in the archival complex. Learning from the source was a great experience for our students.







From 2pm to 2.30 pm, students watched the video presentation of Pattanam excavation. From 2.30 to 4.30 pm, Public interface was arranged. Students got the opportunity to meet the entire KCHR team and had interaction with them. Dr. P.K. Michael Tharakan, KCHR Chairman and Dr. P. Sanal Mohan, Director, both, renowned historians of Kerala, lead the interactive session. The students and teachers actively participated in the interface. The entire crew was happy to share their academic expertise and assured future assistance also. Majority of the students got opportunity to clear and clarify their doubts related to their projects.








8. RELEASE OF HISTORICA


19. Kazhcha 2020


Various sessions of the one day seminar on Entrepreneurship Skills : Changes & Challenges

Total number of Participants of the programme was 37.




5. One Day Seminar "Next Generation Book Keeping: Skill for Accountants" (29th August 2019)






10. One Day Seminar: Building Entrepreneurial Skills (13 January 2020)


14. National Webinar on "Online Plagiarism Checking: An Easy Approach" (28th May 2020)

In order to make our lockdown days more fruitful and as a brighter side of it, we arranged a webinar on the title **Online Plagiarism Checking –An Easy Method for IPR Protection** on 21st May 2020. The talk was arranged in association with Research and Postgraduate Department of Commerce and IQAC. The programme was mainly for the postgraduate students of Department of History and Commerce. The resource person was Ms. Jyothy Maria Johny, Research scholar, University of Kerala. Thirty nine students participated in the webinar. Objective of the talk was to give training on online plagiarism checking. The talk also intended to convince the students, about the need for uniqueness of the work as well as the originality of the work. It also wanted to communicate how academic dishonesty devalues everyone else's hard work. The webinar could provide a broad view on different Plagiarism Detection Tools such as Dupli Checker, Copyleaks, Paper Rater, Plagiarisma, Plagiarism Checker, Plagium, PlagScan, PlagTracker, etc.




1. Association inauguration and commemoration of Hiroshima Day

4. Department of Commerce (Self Financing)

During the academic year of 2019-2020, Department of Commerce Computer Application constitutes 6 faculty members and 84 students. Of these, 30 students have taken admission for the first year. Orientation classes and Bridge courses were conducted by Henry Baker College for the newly admitted students. The department evaluates the score of Bridge courses as one of the criteria for identifying advanced learners and slow learners. The Department offers various programmes for advanced learners to enhance their skills, we conducted discussions and seminars on the topic and encourages students to participate in various symposiums like quiz, poster presentation, inter institution competition etc. Measures were taken for improving the academic performance of those students. For slow learners, remedial/extra classes were taken with appropriate focus on the subjects. Moreover, individual academic counselling has been conducted with the concerned subject teacher.

During is this current academic year, our department conducted a variety of academic and non-academic programmes. HBC Salute the Indian Army, Corporate Quiz, Career Care, Environment Day Celebration are some of them. HBC Salutes Indian Army is a programme to salute and honour the martyrs, who gave their life for freedom, welfare and progress of our country.

HBC Career Care is an effort from our department which provides career guidance right from the school students. Proper classes were offered to them on their interest, stream of study and available career options. Environment day celebration was a program structured to increase student's awareness of the importance of the environment. It promotes good practices that are able to generate an aggressively positive impact on our planet. In addition, the department led programs such as the Men's Day Celebration, Industrial Visits and so on. Students visited Ernakulam Metro Station and Wonderla as part of their industrial visit. B.Voc Tourism and Hospitality Management

Introduction

Henry Baker College Melukavu got sanctioned B.Voc: Tourism and Hospitality Management from UGC as per NSQF along with few other colleges under MG University, Kottayam. This course is the first B. Voc course in the college and sixth Undergraduate course affiliated to MG University, Kottayam.

The three year degree course, B.voc Tourism and Hospitality aims at enabling the learner to seek employment after any level of learning and upgrade qualifications or skill competencies either to move higher in the job profile or in the higher educational system.

The details of the activities done during this new academic year of 2019-2020 are as follows:

1. MONSOON MARATHON


