



# **Goods and Service Tax** (GST Seminar)

18 January 2017

The Henry Baker College, Melukavu, Research and PG Department of Commerce, had organised a GST Seminar on 18Jan 2017, at the HRDTC Centre . The programme was inaugurated by Rt.Rev. Dr.KG Daniel ,Bishop CSI East Kerala Diocese. Dr. Thomas Thoonkuzhy ,Registrar, Gulathi Institute of Taxation Studies was the Chief Guest and Resource Person. Dr Antony Joseph , Kallampally welcomed the gathering . He stated the importance of such a seminar in this changing business conditions . The programme was intended for Entrepreneurs, Students , Teachers and general public as a whole

Dr.ThomasThoonkuzhy in his session explained the various changes that came to the tax structure in compared to VAT.Actually it was an interactive session .Many of the participants had cleared their doubt. GST will be a beginning of a new regime as "One Nation One Tax" and game-changing reform for Indian economy by developing a common Indian market and reducing the cascading effect of tax on the cost of goods and services. It will impact the tax structure, tax incidence, tax computation, tax payment, compliance, credit utilization and reporting leading to a complete overhaul of the current indirect tax system. GST will have a far reaching impact on almost all the aspects of the business operations in the country. Industry experts call it more as a business reform rather than the Tax Reform. The Government of India seems committed to replace all the indirect taxes levied on goods and services by the center and states and implement GST by July 2017. With GST, it is anticipated that the tax base will be comprehensive, as virtually all goods and services will be taxable, with minimum exemptions. Thus it is important for Industry professionals to get acclimatized with this new regime.

The Debate club of Henry Baker College, Melukavu plays a vital role in developing the critical thinking faculties of the students. The club provides the students an insight to think out of the box and analyze the particular subject matter with logical consistency, factual accuracy. It also enhances the communication skills of the students. The club organized two debates during the academic year 2016-17.

The Debate Club inaugurated its activities of the year 2016-17, by conducting a debate on the topic "Euthanasia Should Be Banned" on 2 August 2016 in the Auditorium at 1.00 p.m. Prof. Korah Jacob, Assistant professor, Department of Economics, Henry Baker College Melukavu, served as the Moderator of the debate. The Judges were Prof. Paul Mathews, Department of English, Prof. Beena Paul, Department of History and Prof. Ashley Mereena Mathew, Department of Commerce. There were ten participants. The participants put forward valid arguments in favour and against mercy killing. There were discussions on voluntary euthanasia, involuntary euthanasia and non-voluntary euthanasia and active and passive euthanasia. The main argument of the proponents of euthanasia is that as some diseases are incurable, it is better to relieve the patient from the disease and pain. But the opposing side argued that the right to live is a natural and fundamental right of human beings. If euthanasia is legalized, it provides someone the power to end some others life. The students of the Department of History and the Department of English bagged the first and second prizes respectively.

A debate on another interesting topic "Are Men stronger Than Women?" was held on 13 February 2017 at the Seminar Hall at 4.00 p.m. Prof. Paul Mathews, Assistant professor, Department of English, Henry Baker College was the moderator. The judges were Prof. Korah Jacob, Department of Economics, Prof. Dona Sebastain, Department of English and Prof. Jennipher Carlos Hossanna, Department of Commerce were the judges. Twelve students participated in the debate. They proposed the arguments that men are physically stronger than women, while women are mentally stronger than men. 
