## ONE DAY WORK SHOP ON NEW EDUCATION POLICY -2020

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Henry Baker College, Melukavu organized a one-day Workshop on New National Education Policy – 2020 of on Thursday, 27th August 2020. The event was graced by Bishop Rt. Rev. V.S Francis, Honourable manager of the College. Dr.Zakkariya K A, Professor, Cochin University of Science and Technology as Resource Person and Dr.Gireesh Kumar G.S, Principal, Henry Baker College Melukavu as President of the Workshop.

The main objective of this Workshop was to create awareness about the newly launched National Education Policy-2020 amongst teachers and other stakeholders in the higher education system. The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi approved the National Education Policy-2020 on July 29, 2020. This is the third Education Policy in India after independence (1968, 1986 and 2020).The new National Educational Policy-2020 seeks to introduce and implement a sea of changes across all levels of education in India, including the essential understanding of education in the country.

The main objective of this Workshop was to create awareness about the newly launched National Education Policy-2020 amongst teachers and other stakeholders in the higher education system. The Union Cabinet chaired by the Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi approved the National Education Policy-2020 on July 29, 2020. This is the third Education Policy in India after independence (1968, 1986 and 2020).The new National Educational Policy-2020 seeks to introduce and implement a sea of changes across all levels of education in India, including the essential understanding of education in the country.



Dr. Santo Jose, IQAC Co-ordinator of the College began the session by delivering welcome address .The key speaker for the Dr.Zakkariya K A, Professor, Cochin University of Science and Technology shared the vision for Higher Education in India – 2020 with a focus on three main elements i.e. Students enrolling in the Higher Education System, Holistic and Multidisciplinary Education and Educational Technology and Online Education. The policy is based on the pillars of “access, equity, quality, affordability, accountability” and will transform India into a “vibrant knowledge hub”. The substantial impetus placed on vocational education or hands-on learning in the new policy will give rise to multiple hybrid jobs. With the rapid progression of information technology, and to be able to offer the students a much broader, multidisciplinary foundation, he expressed the importance of using a holistic and multidisciplinary learning approach which will help the learners adapt and reinvent themselves to the demands of the new hybrid work culture and dynamic socio-cultural changes.

He highlighted the National Educational Technology Forum which provides independent evidence-based advice, builds institutional and intellectual capacities, envisions strategic thrust, articulate new directions, and also research. He explained that the regulatory system of higher education will ensure that the distinct functions of regulation, accreditation, funding, and academic standard setting will be performed by distinct, independent, and empowered bodies. These four structures will be set up as four independent verticals within one umbrella institution, the Higher Education Commission of India (HECI).

Dr.Zakkariya K A shed light on the current state of the Learning Crisis, which gave way to the creation of this new structure i.e., it replaced the 10+2 with 4+3+3+2+3. He point out that M.Phil has been scrapped PhD program can be done after a Masters' degree or 4-years Bachelor's Degree. The undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications, e.g., a certificate after completing 1 year in a discipline or field including vocational and professional areas, or a diploma after 2 years of study, or a Bachelor's degree after a 3-year program, the 4th year will mainly base on Research. By 2040, all higher education institutions (HEIs) shall aim to become multidisciplinary institutions, Academic Bank of Credits to be established to facilitate Transfer of Credits .It is said that it is a policy for the 21st century.



The policy views Quality Universities and Colleges as part of the New and futuristic Vision for India's Higher Education System. This policy envisions a complete overhaul and re-energizing of the higher education system to overcome these challenges and thereby deliver high-quality higher education, with equity and inclusion. It aims to make India the global knowledge superpower ensuring equity and Inclusion. He concluded the session by emphasizing the challenges faced in New Education Policy – 2020.

41teachers and 11 other stakeholders participated in this Workshop. Sri. Jenipher Carlos Hosanna, IQAC Joint Co-ordinator of the College delivered Vote of Thanks. The workshop ends at 4.00 pm.

# SVEEP

Our NSS unit actively participated in the Systematic Voters' Education and Electoral Participation programme -SVEEP which was the flagship programme of the Election Commission of India for voter education. The prime goal of this programme was to build a truly participative democracy in India by encouraging all eligible citizens to vote and make an informed decision during the elections.



The programme is based on multiple general as well as targeted interventions which were designed according to the socio-economic, cultural and demographic profile of the state as well as the history of electoral participation in previous rounds of elections and learning thereof. Under the leadership of Sri. Ashok Alex, Nodal Officer SVEEP Kottayam, and NSS programme officers, ten NSS volunteers of our college actively participated in the programme for 5 days from 29.03.2021 onwards. The students encouraged the eligible citizens of Melukavu panchayath to vote especially the voters of the Booth Nos. 42 and 39, which recorded the lowest polling percentage, about the value of voting. They gave awareness to the targeted population about voter registration, electoral registration, electoral process, EVM/VVPAT and ethical voting, etc. They distributed notices, booklets, masks and sanitizers provided by the Election Commission of India. They also, equipped the electors with basic knowledge relating to the electoral process. Sri. Jithin Abraham, (Dept of Physical Education) Sri, George Thomas P V (Dept of Commerce) and Sri. Boban Joseph (Dept of English) provided necessary support for the programme to make it a success.

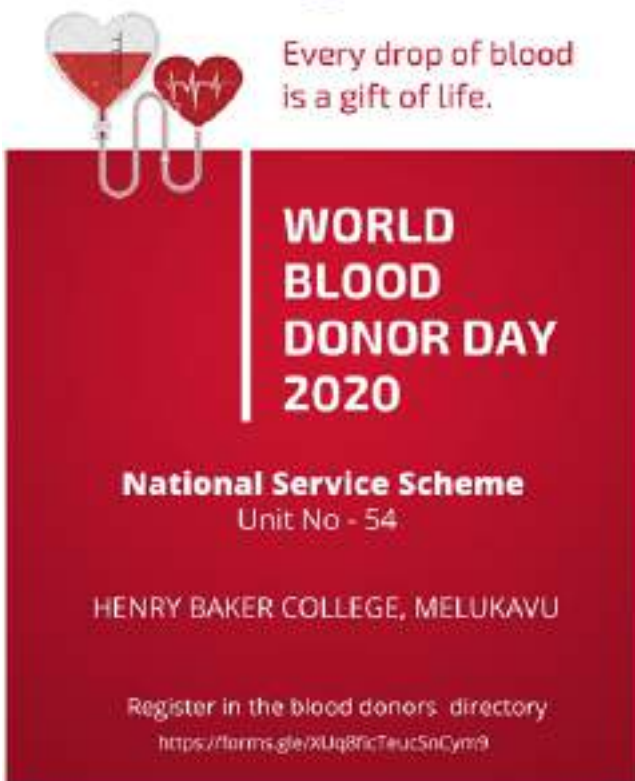

## World Environment Day Special Programme: "Plant a Tree and Add a New Friend Challenge"

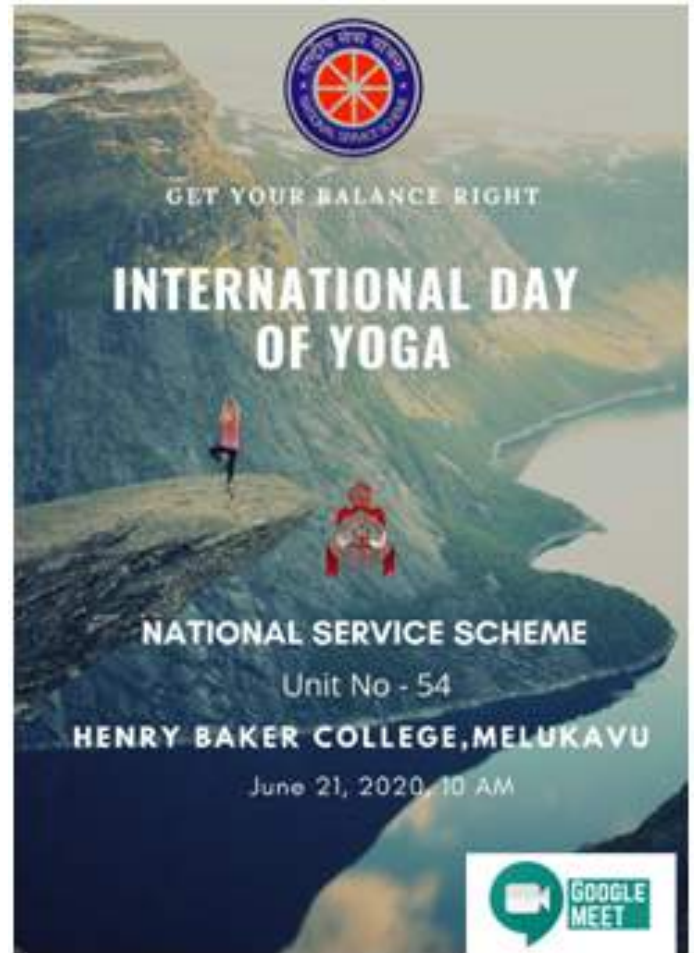

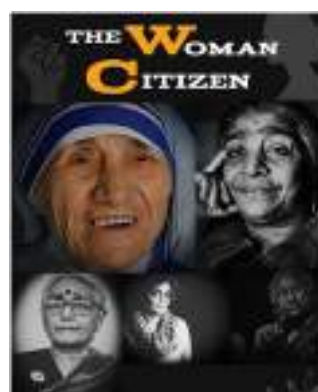
## Webinar on ‘Women in Leadership: Achieving an equal future in a COVID-19 world

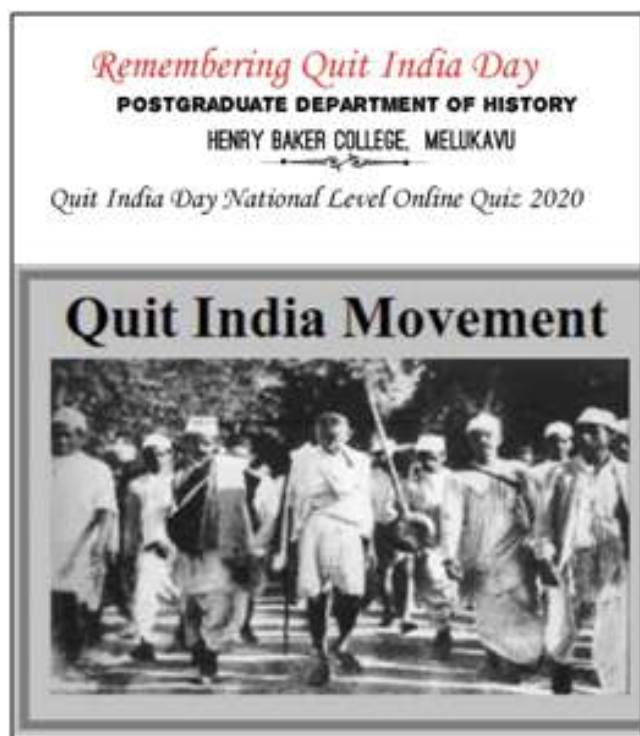
## Job Orientation Skill Development Programme

We all know about the climate crisis – which includes global warming and climate change, however, how is the climate crisis and the work done by cooperatives linked?

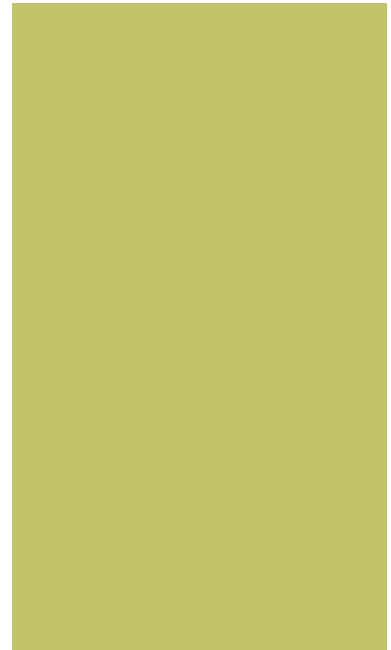
Unsustainable business practices have been recorded as one of the biggest causes of climate change throughout history.

According to Prof. Satheesan, “corporate undertaking operating in different sectors – like agriculture, retail, housing, education, and social services – operate within Earth's atmosphere. These organizations have an impact on the environment, economy, and society in the areas where they have been established and operated. However, why do these undertakings come into the spotlight when it comes to the global climate action plan? Well, a study done in 2016-2017 found that almost two-thirds of the industrial carbon emissions produced between 1880 and 2010 came from just 90 companies. And, the emissions from these 90 companies have added to the climate crisis in significant ways.”

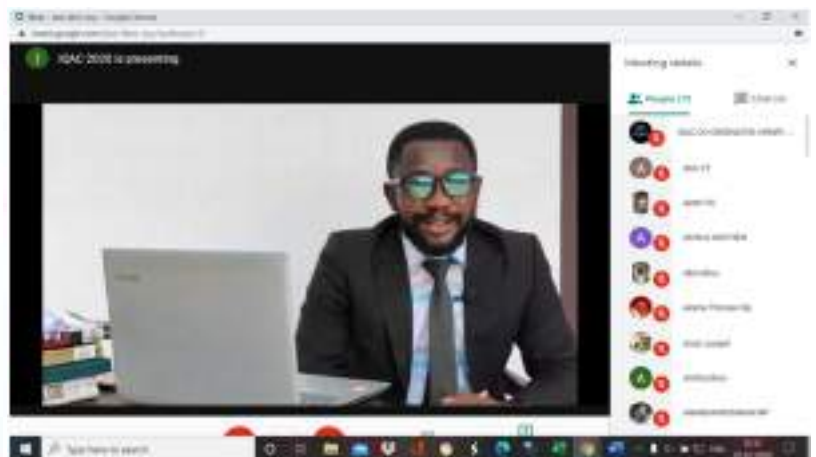
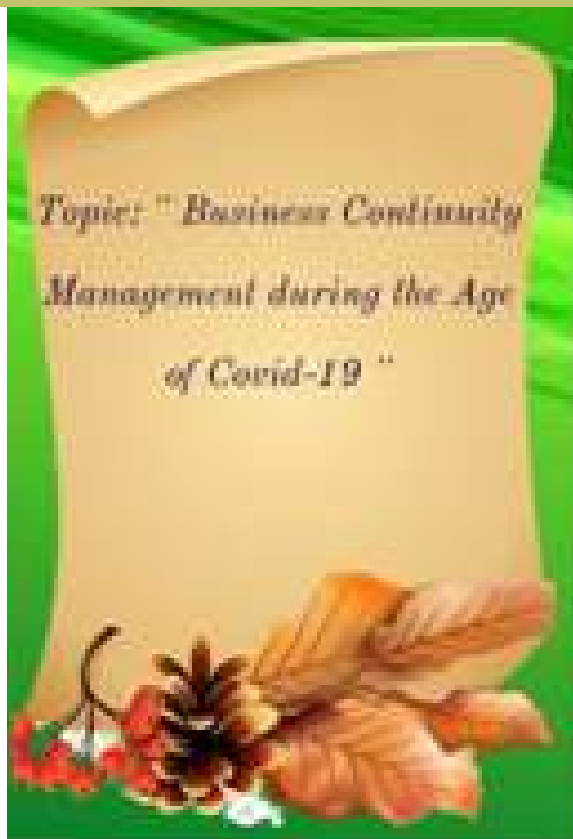
This webinar on business continuity planning (BCP) mainly covered two important aspects:

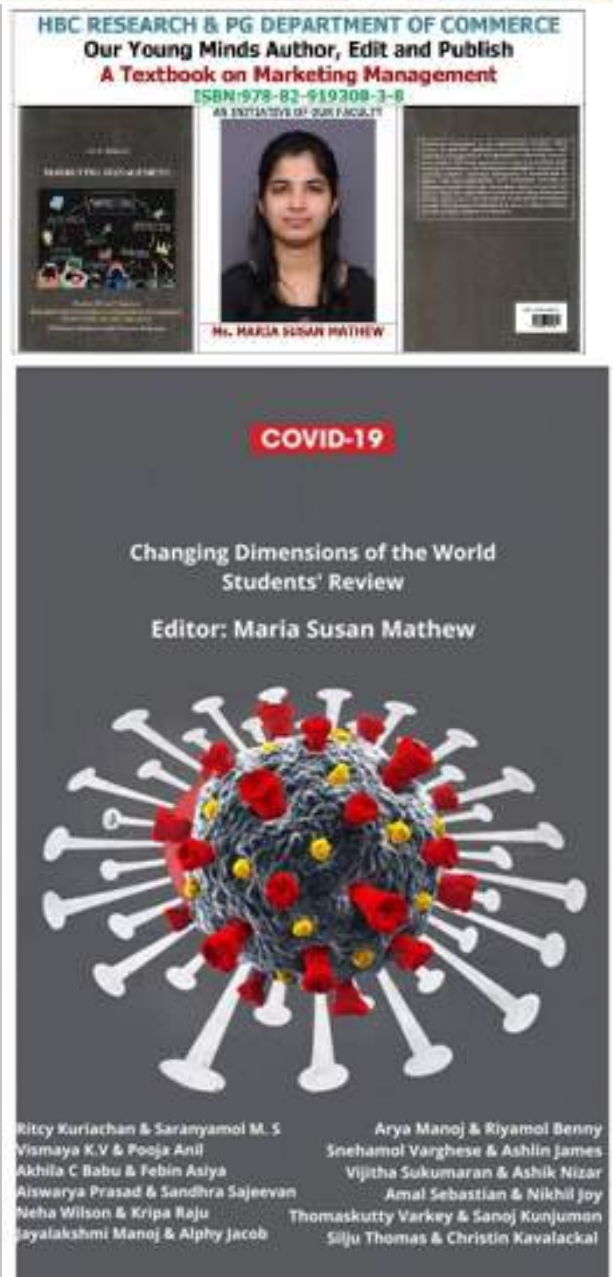
There was a Question and Answer Session at the end of the webinar. 79 students and 4 faculties participated in this webinar.



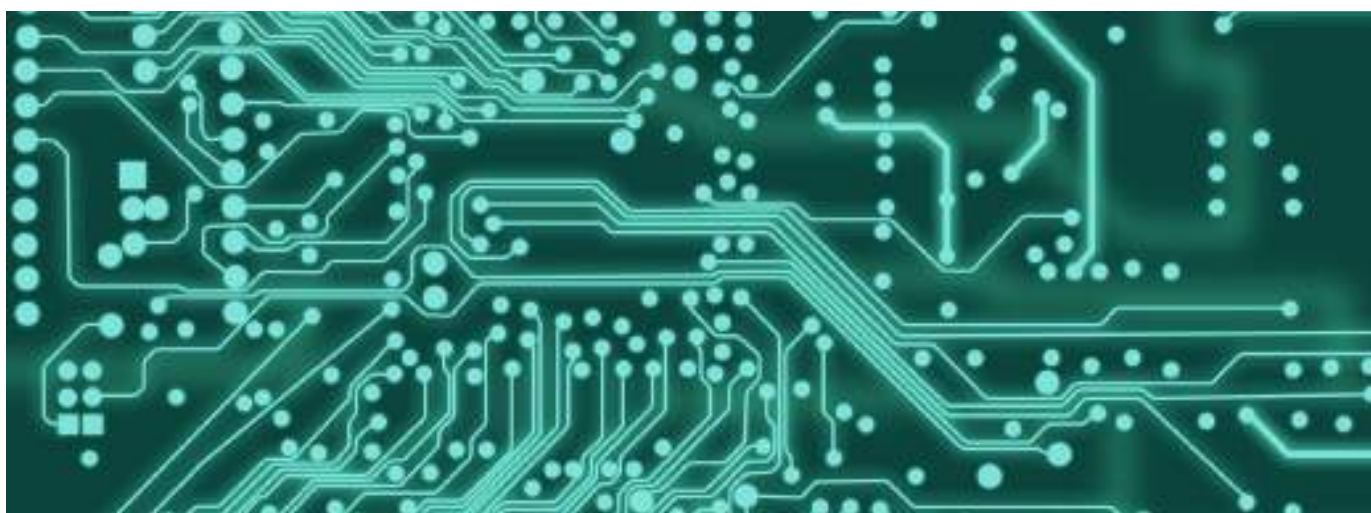
