1. Research Methodology Workshop


Date: 23-08-2022

A workshop on Research Methodology was conducted on 23 August 2022 at the Seminar Hall for the Final Year B. A. English students to equip them with the mode of research and the format for writing the Project which is part of the syllabus. Dr. Eldhose C. Y., Assistant Professor, Department of English, Mar Athanasius College, Kothamangalam was the Resource Person. The Head of the Department of English welcomed the chief guest and the gathering. Sri Paul Mathews Assistant Professor, Dept of English introduced the Resource Person. The Principal, Dr. G. S. Gireeshkumar delivered the presidential address. Dr Eldhose C. Y. spoke on the various aspects of research in English that dealt with topics like what is Research? How to identify a research problem? How to formulate the research questions and objectives? What is the methodology that should be followed? And what are the allied fields of research that a literature student could direct her critical mind to roam on. It was a two-hour session that was immensely useful to the students. It was followed by an interactive session in which the students raised their doubts and sought clarifications regarding the topic. 
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2. Writing Competitions held as part of the Anti-Narcotic Drive

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
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5. Art Exhibition: Alchemy of Colours

Outcome: The students could display their artistic talents and the spectators could enjoy the aesthetic relish that art provides







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

of the programme an examination was conducted to evaluate the cognitive levels of the students. At the end of the course the participants as well as student-teachers were given certificates.






















7. Book Talk


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
Objective: To encourage the reading habit of B. A. English students by drawing attention to noted literary works




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9. Green Initiatives: Distribution of Paper Pens with Seeds


Date: 24-03-2023

10. Literary Quiz


Date: 29-03-2023

11. Writers and Their Work

Objective: To enhance the presentation skills of the students and to invite attention to the life and career of acclaimed authors

"Writers and Their Work' is a programme devised for enhancing the presentation and analytical skills of the final year English students. It also aims to familiarize the students of literature with the luminaries of English literature. Selected students of Final Year B. A. English make presentations on a writer of their choice. Before the presentation they submit a written script to the department. A brief biographical sketch if the selected writer and a detailed account of his/ her major works are discussed in the backdrop of the socio-cultural milieu of the writer, the specific literary movement of which they are part of and the stylistic and aesthetic aspects of his/her work that make them singularly significant are given focus in the presentation. The presentation is followed by a session in which the students and teachers raise questions and make comments. Based on the ideas evoked through this discussion the draft script is revised




13. Poster Designing
