FEEDBACK OF VARIOUS STAKEHOLDERS ON CURRICULUM

Feedback from stakeholders is an essential element of the learning process. The college collects feedback on the content of the course, relevance of the curriculum, allocation of credits, competencies expected, effectiveness of the evaluation system and inculcation of values. The feedback collected was analysed and taken into the consideration for the development of our learning system.

In the current academic year, 172 students participated in the feedback survey. There were 5 measures on the feedback forms which are the timely completion of the syllabus, transparent examination processes and innovative teaching methods such as online resources and ICT tools. Additionally, it focuses on enhancing students' knowledge, skills and analytical abilities through academic and extra-curricular activities. To further improve academic performance, attention should be given to supporting slow learners, enhancing library resources, and creating a more conducive learning environment.

Likert scale measurement was used in the questionnaire, where excellent is scored as 5, good 4, very good 3, average 2 and poor 1..

The student feedback analysis for 2023-24 reveals a generally positive outlook on various academic and infrastructural aspects of the institution. The vast majority of students (89.5%) reported that the syllabus was fully covered on time, while 53.5% consistently found the examination and valuation systems transparent, though some expressed occasional delays. Faculty teaching methods incorporating ICT and online resources received favorable feedback, with 89.5% rating them as good or better, and most acknowledged students that academic activities effectively promoted skill development and employability. Career orientation in the syllabus was also wellreceived, with 90.3% finding it beneficial. Resources in the library, including digital materials, were rated positively by 93.8%, and the academic environment was noted to encourage higher studies. Additionally, support for slow learners was appreciated, with 61.6% finding it frequently or always provided. Extracurricular activities were rated highly by most, with a cumulative 88.8% rating them as good or better. Campus infrastructure and the academic environment were favorably rated by about 90% of respondents, underscoring a conducive environment for learning. Overall, the institution's ambiance received high marks, with 90.2% of students finding it satisfactory or better, reflecting a well-rounded and supportive educational atmosphere.

The Teachers Feedback Analysis reflects a generally positive outlook on the college environment and resources. A significant majority (70.8%) agreed, and 29.2% strongly agreed that the college provides a conducive teaching environment. Regarding ICT facilities, 70.8% of teachers agreed on their adequacy, with 20.8% expressing strong satisfaction. The library was also favorably rated, with 66.7% agreeing it is well-equipped and accessible, and 20.8% strongly agreeing. In terms of staff development, 37.5% reported that needs are "Usually" addressed, while 33.3% felt they were met "Every Time." Overall, the feedback underscores positive teacher satisfaction with the college's facilities and support systems.

The alumni feedback for 2023-24 reflects a positive view of the institution's academic environment, curriculum, and orientation, though some areas highlight opportunities for alignment with industry needs. A strong majority (95%) rated the academic environment as conducive for learning, with 45% finding it excellent. Similarly, 85% appreciated career orientation in the syllabus, noting its relevance in preparing them for future career paths. Curriculum delivery was praised, with 92.5% rating it as good or better, and 90% of alumni found the library resources sufficiently resourceful. While 60% felt the curriculum aligns well with industry needs, a small portion indicated room for improvement. The environment for higher learning was also highly rated, with 57.5% stating it was consistently suitable, though a few saw it as occasionally lacking. Finally, the degree's relevance to current job requirements was marked as moderate to a great extent by 85% of respondents, the program's underscoring overall effectiveness in fostering employability, though it suggests room for further adaptation to specific industry demands.

OVERALL ANALYSIS

The feedback analysis for 2023-24 across students, teachers, alumni, and employers paints a cohesive picture of the institution's strengths, as well as areas for growth in meeting educational and industry standards. A major highlight is the institution's effectiveness in curriculum delivery, as reflected by the high percentage of positive responses from all stakeholders. Students reported that the syllabus was fully covered on time, which speaks to the commitment of faculty members and the planning efficiency of the administration. Teachers also shared a favorable outlook, with many agreeing or strongly agreeing that the college provides a conducive teaching environment supported by adequate ICT facilities and well-resourced libraries. Additionally, alumni and employers recognized the curriculum's focus on career orientation, indicating that the academic offerings are aligned with job readiness and practical skills.

However, the feedback also hints at potential areas for enhancement, especially in curriculum updates to better meet evolving industry standards. Alumni and employers noted that while graduates were well-prepared for workplace environments and demonstrated valuable skills, there is room to further tailor the curriculum to match specific industry demands. To address this, the college could consider integrating more industry-specific modules or workshops within the curriculum and offering internships and networking opportunities that foster direct industry engagement. Enhancing faculty development programs focused on emerging technologies and industry trends could also benefit both the teaching quality and the curriculum's relevance.

Another important insight from the feedback is the strong focus on skill development and employability, which is emphasized by the institution's commitment to providing innovative teaching methods and academic support for slow learners. Students highly rated the use of ICT and online resources, and employers valued graduates' adaptability to new technology, signaling the importance of continuing to invest in digital and skill-based resources. To further support employability, the college might expand its skill-development workshops, focusing on areas like teamwork, leadership, and adaptability, which employers

identified as valuable qualities. By increasing opportunities for practical application, such as through project-based learning or group assignments could further enhance these skills.

Overall Insights and Action Points:

Overall, this feedback underscores a positive educational environment that fosters growth, employability, and a supportive atmosphere for both students and faculty. In terms of action points, the college could prioritize updating the curriculum to align more closely with industry needs, enhance faculty development to address modern skills and trends, and provide additional opportunities for experiential learning. Maintaining a strong academic environment, conducive teaching resources and a commitment to continuous improvement will enable the college to further strengthen its reputation as a progressive, student-centered institution.
