
#### 2. Malala Day Observance

#### Objectives-


- To celebrate the rich heritage of Kerala and to make students familiar with the festival and culture.

Students of the Department of History and English bagged the first and second prizes in the Thiruvathira competition. Prizes were distributed by the Principal.




















#### 4. International Girl Child Day Celebrations

Outcome-The event highlighted the artistic splendor of the students.








#### 5. Imprints

Outcome-The programme paved way to remember and honour our mother tongue and motherland.














#### 7. Talk Show-Atrocities against Women.. Solutions



#### 9. VIVA KERALAM-Free Haemoglobin Check-up for Girls

Objective-To check out the HB level and provide special health service to the needy.

To provide awareness to girl students on various health issues related to anaemia.

Women's Cell and Gender Justice Forum in association with CHC Edamaruk organised an awareness talk on health and hygiene on 20/3/2023. A free haemoglobin checkup was also arranged along with that. It was exclusively for the girl students and women faculty of the institution. The programme started at 10.15 am with the introductory remarks of the Principal. Dr.Beena Paul, Convenor, Gender Justice Forum welcomed the gathering. Dr.Sarala A.C, Medical Officer, CHC Edamaruk gave a talk on Anaemia and its after effects. Her talk emphasised the need for blood check up and maintaining a healthy life. She also provided valuable insights on how to maintain normal HB level. Mrs.Elizabeth Joseph, Coordinator, Women's Cell proposed the vote of thanks.

After the formal function there was a spot registration in which the names and addresses of girl students were registered. The students from various departments were asked to queue up for the checkup. The nursing staff under the leadership of Dr. Sarala examined the HB level of the girls and explained whether they are healthy or not. A total of 12 students were identified as having low HB level and they were advised to take certain food items that increase the HB level. They were also referred to the health centre or other medical centres for further need. Thus an effective follow up was done for the anaemic persons. The free HB check up camp was a great success.






Awareness class on Anaemia by Dr. Sarala A.C, Medical Officer, CHC Edamaruk

As part of the VIVA Keralam project, in association with CHC Edamarukku ,169 girl students of Henry Baker College, Melukavu underwent Haemoglobin test. Haemoglobin level of 12 students were below 12. As per the directions from CHC Edamaruku, they were directed for further check up.


