I. ASSOCIATION ACTIVITIES

1. Commemoration of Quit India and Hiroshima Nagasaki Day.

The Post Graduate Department of History commemorated Quit India and Hiroshima Nagasaki day on 10th August 2018. Staff and students of the department assembled in the auditorium at 1.20pm. Dr. Beena Paul, HoD of the Dept. of History presided over the meeting. Josna Sebastian of I BA delivered a speech on Quit India. Anu Sugunan, I BA recalled the Hiroshima Nagasaki incident. In order to pay tribute to our National leaders and great freedom fighters, Anjaly Sreekumar and team sung patriotic songs in the meeting. In the meeting students took an Oath of Peace by holding white flags. History Association Secretary, Aravind Shaji, IIBA, recited an oath to the students. The meeting ended at 2 pm. Forty four students attended the programme.



V. ORAL HISTORY INTERVIEWS

I

1. Interview with Kovilmala Ilayaraja

Teachers from the department of history visited Kovilmala, a Mannan tribal settlement and met Ilayaraja on 14th July 2018. He described their life in their Kudy, customs and traditions. He also talked about their social life and their interaction with non-tribal people. He said marriage with non-tribals are at present very high and non-tribals marry Mannan tribes for their landed property. They had a unique custom to protect their people. He also shared his anxiety about their dissipating tribal language.

2. Interview with a veteran CSI Christian missionary Mr. Joseph Mundasseril

Oral History club members of the History department visited and interviewed a veteran CSI Christian Missionary Mr. Joseph Mundasseril on 16th September2018,

at Poomala, Thodupuzha. Mr. Joseph was 97 years old and his wife Aleyamma, 89 years old. They shared their hazards in the missionary field and many early churches were the results of their hard-work. The Interview unravelled the life and work of an early missionary.


3. Interview with an agriculturalist Mr. Achuthan Narayanan, Valavoor

On 12th March 2019 Krishna KS, I MA history student, interviewed Mr. Achuthan Narayanan, a 97 year old agriculturalist, living at Valavoor. He shared his memories of childhood, relationship with the community, knowledge on farming and about the festival of harvesting. The interviewer got the opportunity to record the age old experiences related to farming.



II. Exploration 19

Oral history club of the Post Graduate Department organized 'Exploration 19' on 14th March at 1.20 pm in the Seminar Hall . Dr. Nisha Joseph, Assistant Professor welcomed the gathering. The meeting was presided over by Dr. Beena Paul, HOD of the Post Graduate Department of History. Dr. Gireeshkumar G. S Principal, Henry Baker College, delivered the keynote address. The meeting was to introduce the Oral history explorers and a video presentation on the exploration of oral memories was also arranged. During the occasion documented interviews were also released. Ms. Krishna KS, I MA History shared her experience at the time of interview.



VI. FIELD VISITS

1. Megalithic Site at Kurumannu

On 1st October 2018, I &II MA students, HOD Dr. Beena Paul and archaeologist Dr. Jenne Peter conducted a field survey in a megalithic site at Kurumannu, 6km away from the college. Students got the opportunity to visit a megalithic site. The site had a number of dolmens and Dr. Jenee explained the different aspects of the dolmen. She also explained the possibilities of megalithic settlements in the region. For the first time students got the opportunity to visit an archaeological site, which belonged to the pre- historic period. Students were also astonished to know that the surroundings of the college were once pre- historic settlements.





2. Visit to cave at Mankombu

Hearing about a cave in Mankombu, staff and students of the Department of History decided to explore the place. Dr. Beena Paul, HOD History, Dr. Nisha Joseph, Assistant Professor; Sri. Krishnadas Chinnappan and Kum. Bency Mohandas, Assistant Professor on Contract and students Chinnu George, Asha Venu, Ajith V.R, Muhammed Aby, Aravind Shaji and Abhijith Abhilash visited the cave on 2/03/2019. The team was accompanied by Dr. Cyriac Jose, Assistant Professor in Archaeology, St. Thomas College, Pala. Natives helped us to reach the cave. Cave was mud made. It has five chambers. The mouth of the cave was very narrow. According to the natives the cave has existed for over hundred years. But no human occupation is possible in the cave. Dr. Cyriac after examining the site has an opinion that the cave is not man made but natural.



3. Visit to Urali Tribal Settlement Pattayakudi, Idukki

On 17th April 2019, fifteen first year postgraduate students and two teachers (Dr. Nisha Joseph and Mr. Krishnadas Chinnappan) from the department of History visited Pattayakudi tribal settlement. Pattayakudi is one of the oldest Urali tribal majority areas in Idukki district. The team met Ur Mooppan Mr. Jayarajan and Kunjunj (an elder man from the community). The staff and students got the opportunity to interact with the representatives of the Urali tribe. Ur Mooppan described their culture, traditions, festivals, beliefs, tribal treatment, educational backwardness etc... Mr. Kunjunj, an aged man, spoke about their worship of forefathers, special vows and offerings paid to them, and their hardships during the rainy seasons. The team also interacted with Mr. Gangadharan, a performer of Urali art.

The crew also visited Meenoliyampara, a tourist centre, also famous for Megalithic monuments. The team also visited many Kudis. The visit to Pattayakudi was a wonderful experience for the staff and students.





4. Visit to Sastrayan, SSUS Kalady

P.G students along with their tutor Mr. Krishnadas Chinnappan visited *Sastrayan*, SSUS Kalady as part of fulfilling their academic pursuits. The objective of the exhibition was to improve the learning experience of young generation and to promote interest in scientific technologies from close quarters.


2. *Pralayam* 2018




VIII. ACADEMIC DELIBERATIONS

1. Faculty Development Programme on "Iron Age: Burial Monument and Time Frame"

A Professional Development Programme was conducted in the Post Graduate Department of History on 01.10.2018. Dr Jenne Peter, Assistant Professor, U C College, Aluva talked on

"Iron Age: Burial Monument and Time Frame". Dr Jenne Peter, in her power point presentation, exhibited the photographs of various types of megaliths and explained its specialties to the participants. According to Dr. Jenne Peter, the presence of megaliths in cultural heritage is of great importance for most countries throughout the world. These objects exist in all continents, creating a unique network of priceless cultural geosites. Areas on which megalithic buildings are located create a uniquely mysterious aura; they intrigue, stimulate the imagination, and often evoke the feeling of communing with something supernatural. Since the dawn of time, these places have been surrounded by a specific cult, playing an important role in the development of civilization. Kerala is abundant with megalithic monuments. During her discussion she emphasized the need of preserving such monuments for conserving our past and, in many places, local people sometimes damaged such stones. So, it is our responsibility to preserve our past. Several students asked questions and had a live discussion on the topic. Nineteen students and eighteen teachers attended the programme.






Dr. P.S Manoj Kumar delivering the Lecture on 15 March 2019
